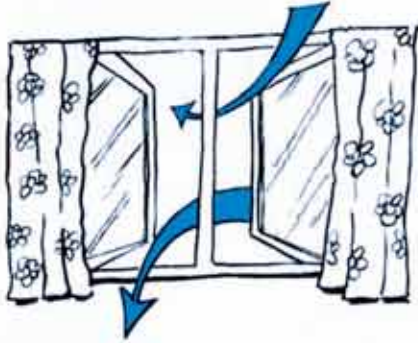


When cooking with LPGas:

Always make sure there is a window open to allow fresh air into the room.



Light the match first, then



Turn on the gas.



Do not use a pot or pan that is too big & place it in the middle of the cooker plate.

Learn more about your favourite fuel and how to get the most out of your LPGas cooker by using it safely



Issued in the interests of a safer South Africa.



Make sure your family & children know how to use LPGas safely.



1. Check all washers & "O" rings and replace them regularly.
2. Check clamps and hose connections.
3. Check the hose for cracks and wear



Do not re-use a cylinder that has been in a fire.



If you smell gas:

Turn off the cylinder.



Do not remove the regulator or appliance until the gas has been switched off.

Close the valve and take the cylinder outside. If there are flames, use a damp cloth to protect your hands.



Take the cooker/cylinder to your nearest dealer to have it checked.

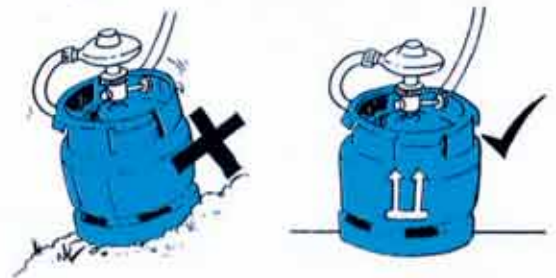
Do not put a leaking cylinder in your car.

Never look for a leak using a naked flame. Use soapy water.



The water will **bubble** if you have a leak.

Using & caring for your cylinder/bottle. Never leave a gas bottle on a stove.



Place your cylinder on a level surface.



Large cookers connect to your cylinder with a regulator.

Small cookers fit **directly** onto the bottle



When buying a new cooker, look for the **LPGSASA Safe Appliance Mark.**
