



## IT IS ILLEGAL...

...to have an LPGas appliance installed by anyone other than a registered LPGas installer. Not only will the warranty be invalidated, you could also face a fine of up to R100 000 and, even, a jail sentence if someone is injured as a result of an installation undertaken by an unqualified person.

For your safety, it is a legal requirement that all LPGas appliances conform to the SANS 1539 standard.

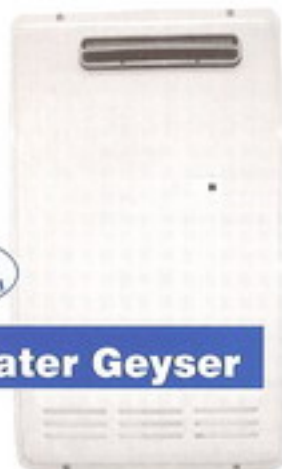
## LPGas Roll-about Cabinet Heater

## How to use your LPGas appliance safely

### How to use your gas appliance:

- Check all connections are secure
- Only open the cylinder valve (tap) 1 1/2 turns
- Light the match before you turn on the gas
- Use a high flame for the most heat
- With a low flame, you don't waste gas
- Close the cylinder valve (tap) when you have finished with the appliance
- Always ensure there is good ventilation in the room (open window)
- Never replace the proper gas hose with garden hose
- Do not leave an appliance burning overnight or when you are out
- Teach the whole family how to use LPGas safely
- Only use appliances which conform to the SANS 1539 standard - or carry the safe appliance mark
- If you are concerned about the condition of your appliance, ask an approved LPGas dealer to check it

### If you smell gas:

- Shut off the cylinder and appliance
- Do not ignite a match or lighter or flip any electrical switches
- Open all doors and windows - let fresh air into the room
- Make sure the regulator and appliance are properly connected and the regulator is firmly in place
- Do not unscrew the regulator while the LPGas cylinder valve (tap) is open or the appliance is still burning
- Move the cylinder (and appliance) outside if possible
- Check for leaks with soapy water, it will make bubbles
- Check for a worn hose, or a damaged regulator "O" ring or for loose hose clamps
- Have the cylinder and appliance professionally checked before using them again

### In the event of a fire:

- Shut off the cylinder - use a wet cloth if necessary
- Move the cylinder and appliance outside if possible
- Do not unscrew the regulator while the cylinder (valve) tap is open or the appliance is still burning
- If necessary, call the Fire Department and tell them LPGas is involved
- Do not use the appliance or cylinder until they have been thoroughly checked by a qualified person
